WELCOME TO OUR WEEKLY PARISH BULLETIN! The month of October is the month of the Holy Rosary. An opening solemn mass had taken place at Saint Angela's on the first Tuesday of this month in order to emphasize the great Marian devotion of our communities. A closing mass as well will take place at Saint Matthew's on Friday October 25. All that aims to be a call for intensive prayer to the Rosary in order to implore abundant graces and favors for all those in difficulty, especially the nation of Haiti whose history has been an ongoing Golgotha ascension. This weekend's gospel actually invites us to be persistent in prayer no matter what. When a defenseless widow is stubborn in pressing a dishonest judge until he gives her justice, that says a lot about our relationship with God our merciful Father who, on his side, greatly delights in granting our prayerful requests. A Haitian proverb says: "a baby who doesn't cry doesn't need breastfeeding." Our prayer should be constant, persistent, obedient, and respectful to God our Lord. It does not depend on immediate concrete results. We don't give orders to God. We don't issue an ultimatum to Him. We may only pray to Him imploring his blessings according to his will. To pray is to remain set on and connected to God as the lamp connected to the power source can enlighten. Even though our prayers have not been granted yet, we are not discouraged, we hope against all hope. Perhaps it's not yet the right moment for them to be granted. But, if we keep trusting in God's providence, our prayers will surely be answered. Everything comes in time to those who put their trust in the Lord. God is never late. May Our Lady of the Rosary continue to assist us through her maternal intercession!

Bien chers frères et sœurs dans le Christ, dans la parabole de l'évangile d'aujourd'hui, Jésus insiste de nouveau sur l'importance de persévérer dans la prière.

Pour Jésus, la prière est liée à la foi faite de confiance, de fidélité et de persévérance. Il rend grâce à Dieu lorsqu'il rencontre sur son chemin quelqu'un qui prie avec foi.

Aucune prière ne se perd dans le néant et ne porte pas de fruit, mais elle reste cachée dans le mystère de Dieu. Il faut accepter d'attendre en silence, confiant en la parole de Jésus : « Quiconque demande reçoit; qui cherche trouve, et à qui frappe on ouvrira

Pour apprendre à prier et pour prier, pour renouveler nos prières et pour persévérer, nous avons les enseignements de la Parole de Dieu, de l'expérience de Jésus lui-même, des saints, d'une grande variété de célébrations dont le sommet est l'Eucharistie.

Demandons-nous : Quelle place accordons-nous dans nos vies à la prière ? Aimons-nous prier ou, au contraire, avons-nous tendance à voir dans la prière quelque chose de «boring», d'ennuyeux dont nous nous dispensons facilement? Rappelons-nous que notre prière est aussi missionnaire... que la foi est la force de l'Esprit qui traverse l'univers et qui le transfigure inlassablement. Riches de tous ces trésors, il nous arrive encore de rester sans appétit spirituel et de ne pas nous presser à nous mettre en prière. «Mais le Fils de l'homme, quand il viendra, trouvera-t-il la foi sur terre?»

Jésus demande avec tristesse, à la fin de ce passage : "Mais le Fils de l'homme, quand il viendra, trouvera-t-il la foi sur la terre ?"

Parole terrible, et qui questionne chacun d'entre nous! Elle montre en tout cas que pour Jésus, il y a un lien évident entre tout ce qu'il vient de dire sur la prière, et la foi. Une prière confiante ne peut reposer que sur la foi en un Dieu bon, miséricordieux, qui prend soin des hommes et femmes de la terre ; La prière est en elle-même une "confession" de cette foi.

La foi ne consiste pas à croire que Dieu existe, mais à croire qu'il peut intervenir dans ma vie (à sa manière, bien sûr, qui n'est pas forcément ce que j'attendais !), si je m'ouvre à son action - et qu'il intervient toujours pour mon bien, même si celui-ci n'est pas forcément tel que je le pense. Seigneur augmente en nous la foi et apprend nous à prier.

D'OU VIENT L'HALLOWEEN? L'Halloween est une fête traditionnelle américaine qui tire son origine de la tradition des Celtes (ancienne tribu de l'Europe, ancêtres des Irlandais). Elle a été introduite aux Etats-Unis vers 1840 par les immigrants irlandais. Le mot 'Halloween' vient de la contraction des mots: « All Hallow Even » qui signifie « le soir de tous les saints du paradis». Les Celtes fêtaient pendant sept jours leur changement d'année : c'était l'occasion de permettre aux défunts de revenir sur terre l'espace d'une nuit pour retrouver des personnes et des lieux qu'ils appréciaient de leur vivant. C'est pourquoi on privilégie les costumes et déguisements effrayants (fantôme, zombie, monstres, sorcières, squelettes...) Aujourd'hui, l'Halloween est essentiellement une fête où les enfants se déguisent et passent de porte en porte le soir du 31 octobre pour faire la récolte de bonbons. On profite de l'occasion pour décorer de façon effrayante les maisons et les terrains, pour faire des bals masqués, visiter des maisons hantées ou visionner des films d'horreur. Les Américains dépensent plus de 2,5 milliards de dollars pour l'Halloween chaque année. En ce qui a trait aux dépenses, c'est la deuxième fête la plus importante après Noël. Même s'il existe des liens historiques avec nos célébrations liturgiques, l'Eglise ne célèbre pas l'Halloween, mais elle célèbre la fête de tous les saints le 1er novembre et commémore les fidèles défunts le 2 novembre.

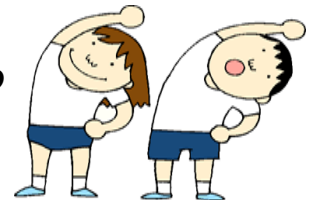

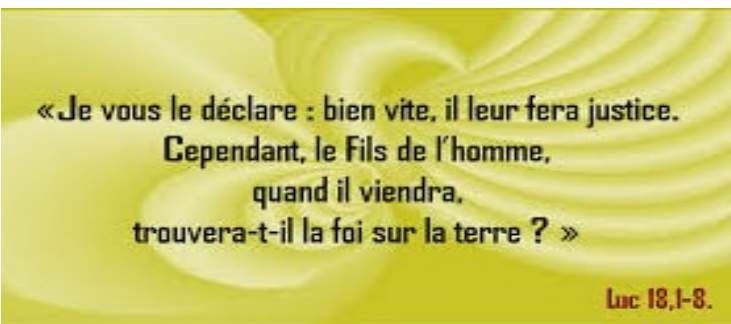
